**Gabriela Cleveland- Illinois Department of Transportation**

Under 92 ILL Adm Code 522.90(a) the Department allows permittees to hold a valid permit for 3 years without building a sign; that is, the permittee has three years to build a sign. At the end of three years if a sign hasn't been built, then the permit becomes void. The permittee may reapply for a permit at the same location after 60 days. I am wondering what other states do?

Arizona	Permit is valid for 120 days. One time extension to build - an extra 60 days. May re-apply.

Colorado	Permit is valid for one year. After one year, if the sign is not built, permit is cancelled.
Connecticut	
Delaware	Permit is valid for 6 months to start construction and one year for completion. May re-apply
Florida	
Georgia	Permit is valid for 12 months. May re-apply.
Hawaii	
Idaho	Permit is valid for 180 days.
Illinois	
Indiana	Permit is valid for 365 days with a single one year extension. Must wait 60 days to re-apply
Iowa	Permit is valid for one year. May re-apply.
Kansas	Permit is valid for 180 days with a single 30 day extension. May re-apply.
Kentucky	Permit is valid for one year.
Louisiana	Permit is valid for either 6 months or 12 months. May re-apply.

Michigan	Permit valid for one year. After one year, if the sign is not built, permit is rescinded.
Minnesota	Permit is valid for 120 days. After 120 days if the sign is not built, permit is void.
Mississippi	
Missouri	Permit is valid for 2 years. After 2 years if the sign is not built, permit is cancelled.
Montana	
Nebraska	Permit is valid for 120 days. After 120 days if the sign is not built, the permit is revoked.
Nevada	Permit is valid for 180 days. After 180 days if the sign is not built, permit is cancelled. May re-apply.
New Hampshire	Permit is temporary and expires on April 1st regardless of issue date. May re-apply.
New Jersey	If permit is revoked, no renewals.
New Mexico	Permit is valid for 120 days. After 120 days if the sign is not built, permit is void. Extensions allowed.

Oklahoma	No time limit to complete/build. However, a marker must be placed at location.
Oregon	Permit is valid for 180 days. After 180 days if the sign is not built, permit is cancelled. May re-apply.
Pennsylvania	Permit is valid for 12 months. After 12 months if the sign is not built, the sign is presumed to be abandoned.
Rhode Island	
South Carolina	Permit is valid for 180 days. If sign is not completed, Dept. has discretion. May re-apply after 90 days.
South Dakota	
Tennessee	Permit is valid for 180 days. If if the sign is not built, permit is void. May re-apply.

Virginia	Permit is valid for calendar year in which it was issued. If the sign is not built, then no extensions or renewals.
Washington	Permit is valid for calendar year in which it was issued. Must be renewed annually.
West Virginia	Permit is valid for one year. If the sign is not built, permit is cancelled. May re-apply.
Wisconsin	Permit is valid for 12 months. If the sign is not built, permit expires. May re-apply.
